## Tom Dominates At Volleyball Grand Prix

**HONG KONG** -- Former Stanford star Logan Tom scored a combined 72 points over the weekend, leading the U.S. Women's Volleyball team to wins over Italy and Thailand and in a heartbreaking loss to China at the FIVB World Grand Prix at the Hong Kong Coliseum.

Tom scored a match-high 26 points to lead four players in double figures as the U.S. women posted a 3-2 win over defending champion Italy on Friday. Tom had 17 kills, a match-high five service aces and four blocks in the 25-20, 17-25, 18-25, 25-22, 17-15 victory.

Danielle Scott added 16 points, Ogonna Nnamani posted 14 points and Tayyiba Haneef added 12 points in the win.

On Saturday, Tom scored a team-high 30 points but it wasn't enough as top-ranked China posted a 3-2 victory. Hao Yang scored a team-high 23 points to lead five players in double figures as the Chinese posted the 20-25, 28-26, 16-25, 25-20, 15-9 win.

On Sunday, Tom scored 16 points and Tayyiba Haneef scored a match-high 18 points to guide the U.S. women to a 3-0 win over Thailand

Haneef pounded 15 kills with two blocks and one service ace in the 25-19, 25-14, 25-20 "Pool E" victory. The Americans now are 4-2 and in fourth place with one week of preliminary matches left. The top six teams and defending champion Italy will advance to the final round.
